Your handy guide to beating head lice

So you've spotted your little ones scratching their heads and you don't think it's a maths puzzle that's causing it.

Don't panie!

Head lice are really common and treating them is easy.

What are head lice?

- Head lice are tiny, harmless insects around the size of a sesame seed.
- They like to live in hair close to the scalp because they need to keep warm to stay alive.
- Head lice have been making jests
 of themselves for thousands of
 years so if you are one of the
 three million jeeple affected in the
 UK every year (they especially love
 school children) you're not alone.
- Now you can lose the louse in just ten minutes: So it's really nothing to worry about.

Top Tips

Head lice don't always
make you itch, especially
when they are first in
residence, so regular
checks are essential.

Make a regular head check part of your weekly family routine - you could to it on a Sunday night, or on a Friday so you can treat them over the weekend.

It's easier to spot white eggs and dark lice against a pale grey coloured comb

If you find head lice on your child, check the whole family as they are no respectors of age or authority, and tell everyone your child has been in contact with.

You can't get rid of head lice with normal shampoo - they can survive underwater for hours.



The best way to evict head lice is to use a quick acting treatment like Solution at bath time. It doesn't smell horrible and applying it is easy and fuss free. You might even manage to treat the kids without them realising as it only takes 10 minutes!

Rejeat the treatment after seven days, to make sure that you break the life cycle of the lorse and kill off any newly hatched lice.



The truth about head lice

- They are lary little critters they can't jump, swim or fly. They simply walk from one head to another, so they can only spread through close, prolonged contact.
- Head lice aren't just for kids. They don't mind setting ut home in onyone's hair, so everyone should watch out for them.
- Not everyone who gets head lice will lich and it's perfectly possible to have them and to completely oblivious.
- Animals don't get or pass on head lice, so you can't blame the dog for this one...
- Keeping your hair short won't help, head lice don't care haw long your hair is.
- There's no need to keep your child away from school if they eatch head lice, but let the school know so that they can make sure all the children they have been in contact with are told. This is called 'contact tracing' and schools know the drill.

What's the best way to treat Head Lice?

DETECT Use a grey cont to make head lice and their eggs easier to spot. Only treat your family if you find a live head louse on the head.

TREAT when you discover head lice, you'll want to get rid of them as quickly as possible — so opt for a treatment like which works in as little as ten minutes. The range is free from pesticides and works by coating lice in a substance that makes them dehydrate, shrink and file. Head lice can't build up resistance to Solution, and it is suitable for people with asthma and sensitive skin.

REMOVE Get rid of any head lice and eggs that have still attached themselves to the hair even once you've treated them by using a cont with fine metal teeth.
