

Merits and Merit cards

Throughout the academic year children are encouraged to complete their Bronze, Silver and Gold merit cards. They can do this by earning merits.

Children will receive merits for:

- Good attendance,
- Good presentation of work,
- Handing work in on time to a satisfactory standard,
- The quality of the questions they ask in class,
- The quality of the answers they give to questions in class or assembly,
- Making valuable contributions to class discussions,
- Achieving targets you have been set, including speaking and listening, reading, writing, spelling and numeracy.



Once the children have successfully completed their merit card, they are awarded with a certificate and a sticker, which is presented to them in our Monday celebration assembly.

House Points

In addition to merits children can also earn house points. Each child in the school has been allocated a 'house'.

The four houses represent the four patron Saints of the United Kingdom.

- St David –Yellow
- St Patrick- Green
- St George- Red
- St Andrew- Blue

House points are given for good behaviour both in class and around the school. During lunchtimes children have the opportunity to earn pegs. The pegs are worth 10 house points and are awarded for good behaviour or being helpful during lunchtimes.

House points are awarded in multiples of 10.



House points are collected and counted on a weekly basis and the winning house is announced in our celebration assembly on Monday mornings. At the end of each term weekly house points are totalled and the winning house is awarded with an additional 15 minutes playtime.
